There is only one God

Deuteronomy 6:4

- If there is only one God, then He must be unique
- The doctrine of the Trinity makes God unique

There is something plural within God

Genesis 1:26

Psalm 45:6-7

Psalm 110:1

Jeremiah 23:5-6

• The Old Testament, which constantly declares there is only one God, nevertheless shows glimpses of plurality

The members of the Trinity are equal but not identical

- Each is fully God and has all the attributes of full deity
- The Father is not the Son, the Son is not the Spirit, and the Spirit is not the Father

• Generally, when the Bible talks about God, it is referring to the Father

• The Son of God took on flesh, we call this the incarnation

• The Holy Spirit shows personality

The Trinity, the God-head, and the phrase "Tri-unity of God" mean the same thing. Regardless of which words you use, the Prophet Isaiah told us what to call them: Holy, Holy, Holy.
